**ANC 1C Support for
The Clean Energy D.C. Omnibus Amendment Act of 2018**

Whereas: The effects of human-caused climate change are already being felt, and a global response to reduce emissions from the extraction and burning of fossil fuels is urgent, if we are to avoid the worst catastrophic climate disruption.

Whereas: The District of Columbia has committed to reducing our greenhouse gas pollution from all sources by 50% by 2032 to help D.C. to do its part in the global effort to address climate change.

Whereas: Using fewer fossil fuels will improve public health in D.C. and reduce rates of Asthma and other diseases.

Whereas: It is important for D.C.'s economy and community to seek policies that avoid increases in the cost of living, especially for low income residents of the district.

Whereas: a robust coalition of more than 80 District organizations and business has been building support for strong substantive action to reduce the District of Columbia's greenhouse gas emissions and speed our city's transition to clean renewable energy sources.

Therefore, be it resolved: Advisory Neighborhood Commission 1C supports the passage of the Clean Energy D.C. Omnibus Amendment Act of 2018 introduced by Councilmember Mary Cheh, and co-sponsored by Phil Mendelson, Charles Allen, Brianne Nadeau, Trayon White, Vincent Gray and David Grosso.
