Minutes of June 2, 2010

A regularly scheduled meeting of Advisory Neighborhood Commission 1C was held on June 2nd, 2010 at Mary's Center. 1C Chairman Wilson Reynolds called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm. Approximately 22-25 members of the public attended during various times of the meeting.

In attendance were Commissioners Stacey Moye (1C01), Chris Otten (1C02), Michael Logsdon (1C05), Nancy Shia (1C06), Wilson Reynolds (1C07).

Commissioner Reynolds motioned to change the order of the agenda due to a quorum issue. Commissioner Reynolds motioned that five items be moved to a Consent Agenda:

I. Consent Agenda

- A) Motion for ANC 1C to intervene in BZA appeal re: 2005 Columbia Road, NW
- B) Motion to designate Chris Otten as ANC 1C representative to the BID and Nancy Shia as alternate.
- C) Motion for ANC 1C to write a letter of support for Fiesta Primavera.
- D) Motion that ANC1C support an Appreciation Certificate for the outstanding parents of HD Cooke Elementary School and Marie Reed Learning Center.

The motion to move these items to a Consent Agenda received a Second from Commissioner Moye and was approved by Voice Vote.

The adoption of the Consent Agenda was approved by Voice Vote.

Commissioner Otten was recognized for a motion concerning contractor work in Kalorama Park. As no written motion was available Chairman Reynolds moved that this item to the Public Services Committee for review. The motion received a Second and was approved by voice vote.

II. MPD and FEMS Reports

Captain Chapman reported on the statistics for the past month and gave a few safety tips about fireworks. Captain Chapman reported that in May, they had responded to 250 calls, with no significant incidents in Adams Morgan. Captain Chapman said that his engine company would review the possibility of having a joint open house in September with ANC 1C.

Sergeant Trinette Green reported on crime statistics in the neighborhood for the last month and handed out pamphlets with theft prevention tips. Sgt. Greene reminded everyone that property theft, particularly theft from auto, remains the most frequent crime committed in Adams Morgan, and residents could help prevent theft by not leaving anything in cars. Sgt. Greene said that the summer curfew for minors is in effect and there are special curfew cars on duty.

III. Officer's Reports

Chairman's Report – Commissioner Reynolds reported on the successful ANC outreach effort on May 15 in front of the Safeway. In attendance was FEMS, with both a fire truck and an ambulance with staff that provided free blood tests. Approximately 45 people took advantage of this service.

Secretary's Report, Secretary Shia reported – The May minutes were presented and approved.

Treasurer's Report, Commissioner Reynolds reported on behalf of Treasurer Boettrich – Receipts were \$5,166.99, expenditures \$4,106.78, ending balance was \$35,467.75

IV. Commissioner Announcements

Commissioner Reynolds announced that ANC 1C would be hosting a public forum on June 24 at 7:30 with DC Council Chairman Vincent Gray at the Festival Center.

Commissioner Reynolds announced that ANC 1C would be hosting a community outreach day at Harris Teeter on June 12. He said that FEMS would have personnel present to provide free blood sugar tests and there would be a fire truck on hand for kids to look at.

V. Committee Reports

b. **Public Services and the Environment**

- 1) Commissioner Shia presented a motion to support a mural project at the Potter's House located at 1658 Columbia Road, NW. The motion received a Second from Commissioner Moye.

Move to support the mural at the Potter's House with a letter from ANC 1C to the DC Commission on Arts and Humanities.

The motion was approved by Voice Vote.

c. **Planning, Zoning & Transportation**

Commissioner Reynolds announced that the Planning, Zoning, and Transportation Committee would meet next on June 7th and would be discussing valet parking on 18th Street during the upcoming 18th Street Streetscape construction.

Commissioner Shia made a motion to adjourn. It was seconded and the meeting ended at 8:05 p.m.
