Please provide a detailed description of what the grant will be used for. *

Jubilee JumpStart thanks ANC1 for your continued support of children and families from low-income households in Adams Morgan. We were very grateful for your 2019 grant that allowed us to purchase of a new buggy for our young students to enjoy the outdoors. Your support, both financial and as advocates for our children, makes a big difference for our families. Jubilee JumpStart provides high quality care and early education to children (ages 6 weeks to 5 years) from primarily low-income households in Washington, DC. We are located in the basement of Jubilee Housing on Ontario Road NW and primarily serve Adams Morgan families. At Jubilee JumpStart, 72% of our 0-3 program and 69% of our Pre-K program are eligible for childcare subsidies. Half of enrolled children are first or second-generation Americans, with families originating from nearly every continent. For our 0-3 program (67% of enrollment) our children represent many heritages, with 47% African American, 25% Hispanic, 3% Asian, and 25% Caucasian backgrounds. For our Pre-K program (33% of enrollment) our children's demographics are 38% African American, 37% Hispanic, 13% Asian, and 12% Caucasian backgrounds.

We request a grant of \$4,000 to purchase Covid-19 relief supplies so we may protect our children, families, and staff involved in our education programs as we re-open the Center. We are reopening slowly with a very limited number of students in July and anticipate welcoming back a larger number of students in September. We have found there are unexpected costs for our education program associated with operations under Covid-19 pandemic conditions. Your grant will fund the purchase of partitions to separate our infant and toddler classrooms as mandated by the DC health department, which costs \$4,335.00.

The total costs of supplies relate to Covid-19 for the Center is more than \$40,000. Other costs include protective clothing and masks for all staff, a portable sink, tents for entry, individual food service containers and food service carts, touchless faucets for all sinks, janitorial supplies, daily deep cleaning services, and individualized classroom supplies for each of our children. The largest expense we expect is to open another Pre-K classroom within a Jubilee Housing building. We are unable to host our classroom of 16 Pre-K students in the same space and plan to split them into two groups of 8. This means we will need to lease additional building space to furnish an extra classroom for our students' and staff's safety. While we did receive relief funds from DMPED and the Paycheck Protection Program, those funds helped us to continue to pay staff during our closure. In May, we were forced to cancel benefit which helps us raise \$100,000 annually.

We will use your grant of \$4,000 to purchase two partition sets from Community Playthings and Versare Solutions LLC. We have chosen these businesses because it is our intent to purchase partitions that fit within the specific school furniture system that we currently use at the Center. In terms of environmental impact, we are selecting high quality furniture that we expect to last for decades into the future. The partitions have multiple uses both indoors and outdoors and it is our intent to use them beyond the pandemic.

We are grateful for the ANC1 for considering our request. A grant from ANC1 would make all the difference in providing a safe reopening at Jubilee JumpStart. This would help us respond to specific needs determined by the Covid-19 pandemic regulations at our Center. It is our goal to help our families by providing childcare they desperately need and help them rebuild from this trauma as they return to our Center. With your support, we will be able to focus our children's, families', and staff's safety and ensure we have adequate resources upon fully reopening in September.
