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Minutes of Meeting of Advisory Neighborhood Commission 1C June 7, 2000

The following is a draft of the minutes of the meeting of ANC 1C held on June 7, 2000. This draft may be revised by the Commission before approval in August.

A meeting of the Commissioners of Advisory Neighborhood Commission 1C (the "ANC") convened at the Marie Reed School at 7:00pm on June 7, 2000.

1. ATTENDANCE

Commissioners present: Letsinger, Schott, Softli, Johnson, Llorente, Miscuk

Commissioners absent: Faith, Wright

2. NOTICE OF MEETING

Each Commissioner and the community received notice of the meeting.

3. PRESIDING OFFICER AND SECRETARY

Commissioner Softli presided, and Commissioner Schott kept Minutes of the meeting.

4. CALL TO ORDER AND INTRODUCTION OF COMMISSIONERS

After a quorum was achieved the Commissioners introduced themselves at approximately 7:05

5. POLICE REPORT

Lt. Hill from PSA301 indicated, among other things, that there were four robberies in May and that six arrests had been made since May 31.

6. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Minutes of the Apr. 5, Apr. 11 and May 3 meetings were presented, but since commissioners wanted time to review them, it was moved by Commissioner Schott and seconded by Miscuk that action on approval be deferred until the next meeting.

7. TREASURER'S REPORT

Commissioner Miscuk reported that ANC 1C has about \$ 25,000 in its account. Llorente moved, Miscuk seconded that the report be approved.

8. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Chairperson Softli indicated we were looking for a staff person to work in our office and suggested we might forgo a July meeting. Commissioner Miscuk objected. Ms. Softli also indicated that Jim Graham's office had completed the transportation study of the Adams Morgan/U St. area

9. PUBLIC SAFETY

Lisa Duperier, Public Safety Committee Community Chair, gave this report.

10. HOUSING COMMITTEE

Commissioner Johnson announced she would be having a housing teach-in June 10, and reminded the commissioners and audience of the importance of this event. Subsequently, after much discussion, the commission approved of an expenditure of \$625 to cover printing and room usage for the event.

11. SMD Reports

Commissioners Schott, Miscuk and Johnson gave SMD reports.

12. SCHOOL INITIATIVE

A debate was held on the upcoming school reform initiative. Larry Gray from the PTA spoke against and Absolom Omer, Mayor's Chief of Staff, spoke in favor.

13. ISSUES CONSIDERED

- A resolution in support of certain police officers was passed.
- A resolution on funds for purchasing a new printer was passed.
- Schott presented a resolution supporting the efforts of the Holt House Preservation Task Force.
- The commission rejected a resolution asking Bank of America to extend its hours.
- The commission supported a resolution asking that businesses and citizens' groups ask the city to clean alleys on a more regular basis.
- A resolution making a technical correction to the Rendezvous restaurant resolution was approved.
- The ANC voted to oppose the license for Crush pending a voluntary agreement, a signed copy of which was presented by the owner.
- The commission after reviewing the plans for a variance by Martin Hardy at a property at 1821-23 Florida Ave. approved of the concept of what he wanted to do at the property.

14. ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned at approximately 9:20pm.

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
